Program Overview

The *Fulbright Degree Program* funds graduate study in the United States leading to *Masters or PhD degrees*. The grant covers tuition, textbooks, airfare, a living stipend, and health insurance. USEFP also assists with the visa process.

All academic disciplines are eligible except clinical medicine.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicant must be a Pakistani citizen, residing in Pakistan during the application process.
- For Master's: Minimum of 16 years of formal education (a 4-year bachelor's degree or a combination of Bachelor's + Master's).
- For PhD: Minimum of 18 years of education (Master's, MPhil, or equivalent).
- Applicants from all academic disciplines (except clinical medicine) may apply.
- **GRE General Test** is required. Under the new scoring system, a minimum of **145 in each section** is preferred.
- Demonstrated fluency in written and spoken English.
- Commitment to return to Pakistan and serve for a period equal to the duration of study funded by Fulbright.

Ineligibility

- Hold dual U.S./Pakistan nationality.
- Have a spouse, parent, or child over 18 who is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- Are employees or dependents of USEFP, the U.S. Department of State, or USAID.
- Have previously received a **Fulbright degree scholarship**.
- Are currently studying or working on a long-term visa in another country.





Application Components

- Online application form (available at www.usefp.org)
- Three reference letters (academic or professional)
- GRE score report
- Scanned transcripts and degrees, with grading scale
- Study or research objectives statement
- Resume/CV outlining academic and professional achievements

Program Benefits

- Full tuition and university fees
- Monthly living stipend + Health insurance
- Round-trip airfare + Visa assistance and pre-departure orientation

Additional Notes

- **GRE Reimbursement:** USEFP may reimburse GRE test fees for applicants meeting qualifying scores (300+ for sciences, 290+ for humanities).
- **Bond Requirement:** Selected scholars must sign a contract to return and serve in Pakistan after completing their studies.
- Language Proficiency: Shortlisted applicants may be required to take the Duolingo
 English Test.
- Work Experience: Not mandatory but recommended for programs such as MBA or Public Policy.

Fulbright Scholar Program (Research & Lectureship Grants)

Program Overview

The **Fulbright Scholar Program** is designed for Pakistani faculty members, researchers, and professionals who wish to conduct **postdoctoral research or teach at a U.S. institution**. The program supports up to **10 months** of academic work in the U.S.

Scholars contribute to their fields through research or lecturing and are expected to share their experiences upon returning to Pakistan.

Eligibility Criteria

- PhD or terminal degree in the relevant field.
- Strong record of academic and/or professional achievement.
- Well-formulated research or lecturing proposal aligned with Pakistan's development goals.
- For lecturing roles: demonstrated teaching experience at the university level.
- Strong English language skills.
- Applicants from all academic fields except clinical medicine are eligible.





Ineligibility

- Those who completed their PhD within the last two years.
- Individuals who have undertaken research or study in the U.S. in the past five years.
- Dual nationals (U.S./Pakistan) or those with **immediate family holding U.S.** citizenship or permanent residence.
- Employees or dependents of USEFP or the U.S. Department of State.
- Applicants currently residing, studying, or working abroad on long-term visas.

Application Components

- Completed online application form (via <u>USEFP website</u>)
- Detailed research or lecturing proposal
- Three reference letters
- Invitation letter(s) from U.S. institutions (mandatory at the time of application)
- Updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)

Program Benefits

- Round-trip airfare
- Monthly living allowance
- Health insurance
- Research / incidental allowance
- Funding support for one accompanying dependent
- Assistance in visa processing and placement

Proposal Guidelines

Applicants are encouraged to:

- Clearly define research objectives, methodology, and expected outcomes.
- Demonstrate how the project contributes to Pakistan's academic, professional, or socio-economic growth.
- Provide evidence of potential collaboration or impact beyond the grant period.

Dependents

The Fulbright Scholar grant allows scholars to bring **one dependent** (spouse or child) with partial financial support. Additional dependents may accompany at the scholar's own expense.
